CLASS OFFERINGS

Here are the descriptions of the classes and the days they will offered. Please read them carefully and then write your choices in the "CLASS CHOICE" section below. You can only participate in ONE class per day. **"Mariachi" requires a two-day commitment, meaning you have to attend both days of the class each week (Tuesday and Thursday).**

MONDAYS

- Paper Mache**- This is an art class using paper, water, glue and paint to create almost anything your imagination can conjure.
- Left To Write**- If you enjoy creative writing or spoken word, or would just like a safe place to try it out, then this program is for you! Budding poets, lyricists, short story writers, autobiographers, novelists, and the grammatically gifted are all welcome.
- CoRe Gaming**- **Atlantic Street Center** is using video gaming to teach social skills, self-calming strategies and healthy choice making.

TUESDAYS

- Majestic Mov**- **Majestic Movers** is a girls dance program. This is the 2nd year that the instructor, Alexis, is offering this program. She teaches girls to choreograph dance routines to perform as a group.
- Games Group** We won't be playing video games, and we won't be playing Monopoly, either – together we'll learn some of the most popular games on the market today, which will not only help build skills around multitasking, teamwork, and interpreting rules, but it will be fun!
- GSA**- **Gender and Sexuality Alliance** is a support group for LGBTQ students, teachers, and their allies, open to discussing news, personal stories, advice, and problem-solving to make Denny a safer and more inclusive school for everyone"
- Skate Like a Girl** This is a skate boarding program facilitated by the organization Skate Like a Girl. In spite of the name, boys are welcome to join this class as well. This program teaches students how to safely ride skate boards.
- S.R.E. Team**- **Student Race and Equity Team** will analyze school data, learn about and identify systemic injustice at Denny and promote school-wide, student-led actions to educate students about and curb systemic injustices.
- Mariachi**- Learn acoustic guitar or violin and have lots of fun singing and playing beautiful Mariachi music! **(two-days)**

WEDNESDAYS

- Zoo Crew**- ZooCrew youth learn about the conservation issues affecting animals, create projects to support ongoing conservation efforts and present their projects at Woodland Park Zoo.
- NG Bridge** **Next Generation Bridge** is wonderful program that teaches students skilled or beginner the card game, Bridge. They also host city-wide tournaments for students to participate in.
- Urban Arts** This is a wonderful preventative program that focuses on using art to engage students in creative ways to promote positive thinking and planning.

THURSDAYS

- Swimming**- Free swim lessons with real lifeguards at **Southwest Community Center**. You must bring your own swim suit and towel to this program activity. There will be no towels or swim suits provided.
- Build A Bike**- **Cascade Bicycle Club** is offering an OST program teaching students to design their own custom bike.
- Girls Who Code** Ladies, join and learn the computer science concepts that form the basis for all computer programming languages, whether you want to build a mobile app, a website, or program a robot
